MC Indoor Championships -1957 - 60 yard dash -1st place 6.5 seconds (meet record) and 1958 - 60 yard dash -1st. place tie in 6.5. 60 yard low hurdles -1st place in 7.4 seconds - new county record. In 1957, WHS team won the first MC Indoor Championship.

MC Outdoor Championships 1958 - 100m - 1st place - 9.8 seconds (meet record and tied state record).

1958 - 200m - 1st place - 21.3 seconds

1958 - BJ - 1st place - 21' 2\%"

MC Outdoor Relays 4 x 100 m - 1st place in 1956 and 1958

PENN RELAYS Sprint Relays -1^{st} place - in 1957 - 3:26.6 1956, the team finished in 2^{nd} place. At the Eastern States, one mile relay, the team finished 2^{nd} in a school record time of 3:25.2. This record held at WHS for over fifty years.




